Joan was among the top five finalists. This selection was based on her appearance in the afternoon parade and at the evening banquet.

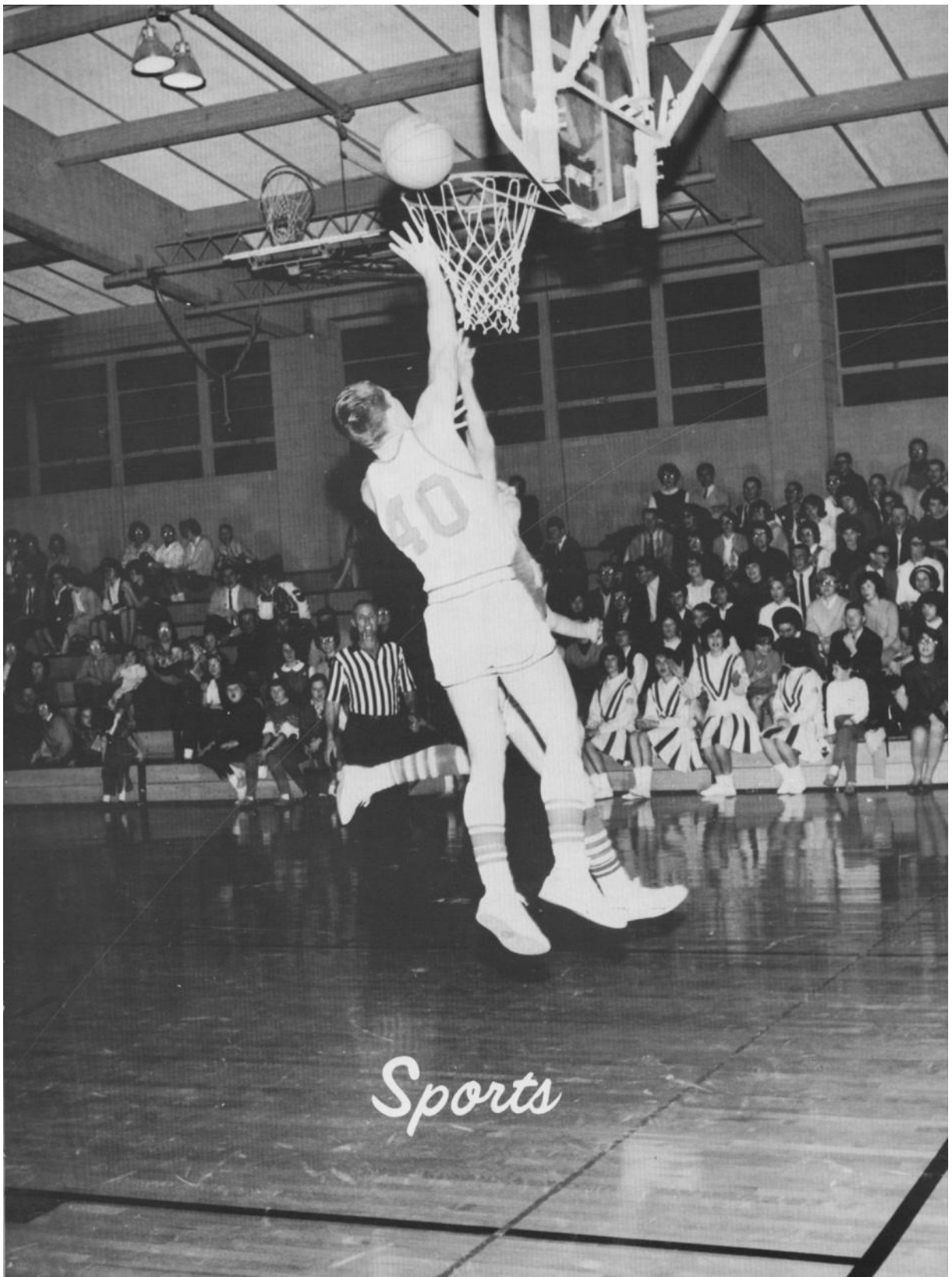

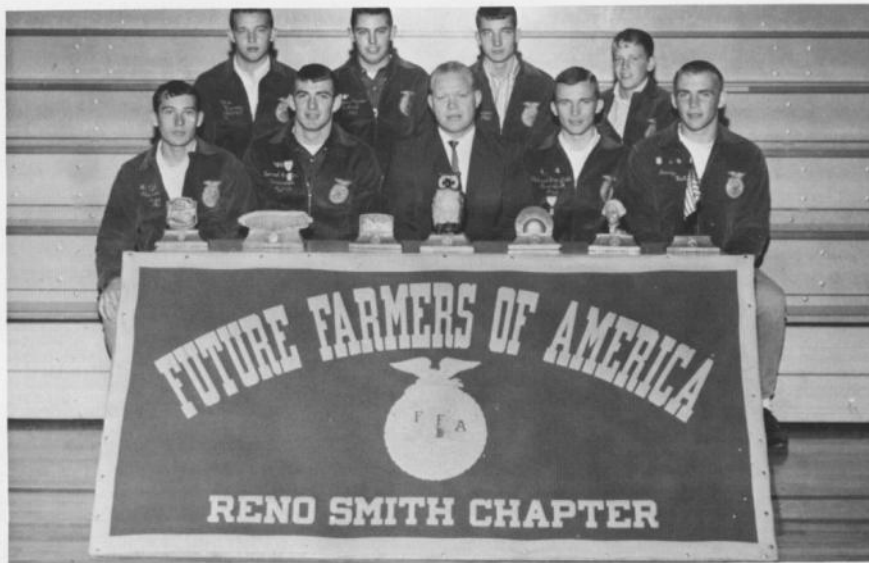
