


### Dedication








Make-up was handled by the Oral Interpretation class under the guiding hand of Kim Smith.





The stingy Jays defense held the opposition to 2.5 yds, per play and a mere 8 points per game. The Jays were well represented when all-conference selections came around. Every regular on the team earned a place on the all-conference roster. Rich Fast and Tony Marsh led the charge as they were selected to both 1st teams offensive and defensive. Rich was also selected to the 1st team all-Southwest Iowa. Ralph Phillip and Brent Sunderman rounded out the Bluejays 1st team selections on defense. Coach Nardini's first year as varsity coach has relieved a two-year drought in conference wins. Falling to Villisca were Greenfield, Nishna Valley, Stanton, Farragut, and Lenox twice. The Jays had high hopes for the sectionals but Stanton proved to be tougher than in the Jays first game of the season.

Mike Schafer and Nick Taylor led the team in scoring, earning an average of 12 and 11 points per game. Bruce Williams controlled the boards with an average of 10 rebounds per game, followed by Jerry Baker with 8. Mike, Nick, Bruce, and Jerry also received Honorable Mention recognition in the Tall Corn Conference. Most valuable player award, voted on by the eight varsity players, went to senior Nick Taylor.

The 1974 Boy's Track season could be considered unsuccessful by many people, except by those who were on the team.




